
BEGIN SUIT TO RECOVER ON JOHN DUPREE'S BAIL BOND

With the filing of a suit in Superior court against John Dupree and Thomas M. Cuslak for damages to recover on a bond furnished for the appearance of Dupree in court there is a growing feeling that Dupree will not again be tried for an offense on which he has been twice convicted. The suit started in Superior court is to collect \$2,500, the amount of the bail bond which has been estreated by the court when Dupree failed to appear for his third trial.

Dupree was convicted of an offense against a young girl and on an appeal a new trial was granted. After long delay a second conviction was secured but one of the jurors was found to be an alien and Judge Stuart granted a motion for retrial. Inquiry on the part of the officers fails to reveal the whereabouts of Dupree.
