

# CASE GOES OVER AGAIN

---

**JOHN DUPREE UNABLE TO APPEAR IN COURT TODAY.**

---

**Prosecutor Brown Is Suspicious and Has County Physician Make an Examination.**

---

With everything in readiness for the trial of John Dupree, the veteran lumberman charged with ill-treating a little girl, another adjournment was necessitated in Superior court this morning because of the illness of the respondent. Attorneys Dunham and Phelps, who represent Mr. Dupree, announced that the client was ill at his home and that Dr. A. J. Patterson and William J. Dunham were attending him. Prosecutor Brown has been compelled to put up with many delays in this case that he has become suspicious and called upon County Physician Montgomery to make an examination.

Dr. Montgomery reported that he found Dupree in bed suffering from nausea, that his pulse was normal, his temperature slightly subnormal. Dupree appeared very nervous and was in no condition to come into court today. The doctor declared, however, that if he was left quiet there was no reason why he would not be fully recovered tomorrow.

After a consultation with Judge Brown the jury was ordered to report tomorrow at 9:30 and it is understood that if Mr. Dupree appears ready for trial a bail of \$2,000 will be estreated. The prosecutor Brown desires to have the case disposed of immediately and after the second trial of Paul A. Tower will be taken up.

In fact if anything happens that should be another delay in the Dupree case the Tower case will be put off immediately. It is not at all improbable that Attorney M. L. Dunham may have Mr. Brown disqualified from prosecuting the case on the ground that his recent appointment to the judgeship might influence the jury.
