

FISHMAN WITHDRAWS FROM GLOCHESKI BOND

Attorney Held in Dupree Case Compelled to Obtain An- other Surety.

Roman F. Glocheski, assistant prosecuting attorney, who is held on a writ of capias in connection with a suit for \$10,000 started against him by John Dupree, was forced to find another bondsman Thursday afternoon when M. Louis Fishman notified Sheriff Berry that he intended to withdraw as surety. Mr. Fishman, together with Harry and Anna Keller, provided bonds in the sum of \$3,000 for Glocheski when he appeared before Judge Dunham in Superior court. Dupree charges Glocheski accepted \$7,000 to remove from the jurisdiction of local courts Margaret Naujalis, a Lithuanian girl who was complaining witness in a case against Dupree.

Mr. Fishman said he would remain on Glocheski's bond until a substitute could be obtained but that he desired release as he was about to leave the city. There also is said to be a legal reason why he cannot remain on the bond.
