Know all Men by these Presents that We, Rachel Corman of the Township of Saltfleet in the County of Wentworth, Widow; Benjamin Soules of the Township of Saltfleet aforesaid, Yeoman; and William Gage of the Township of Glanford in the said County of Wentworth, Yeoman

~~District~~ in the Province of Canada, are held and firmly bound, to His Excellency the Governor, or person Administering the Government of said Province of Canada, in the sum of ~~four hundred and fifty~~ sixty Pounds of Lawful Money of Canada, as aforesaid, to be paid to the said Governor or person Administering the Government of said Province, to which payment, well and truly to be made, we do bind ourselves, and each of us, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, dated the sixth day of August at Hamilton in the Province of Canada, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty three.

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, that if the above bounden Rachel Corman,

Administratrix of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of Alpheus Corman, of the Township of Glanford, Yeoman, lately deceased, do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands, possession or knowledge of her the said Rachel Corman or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons, for her and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Office of the Surrogate Court, on or before the sixth day of February next ensuing; and the same Goods, Chattels and Credits of said deceased, at the time of his death, which at any time after shall come into the hands and possession of the said Rachel Corman or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons, for her do well and truly Administer, according to law. And further do make or cause to be made, a true and just account of her said Administration, at or before the sixth day of August now next ensuing; and all the rest and residue of the said Goods, Chattels and Credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said Administratrix Account, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the Court for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons, respectively, as the said Judge, by his Decree or Sentence, comfortably to the provisions in a certain Act of Parliament, entitled, "An Act for the better settling Intestate Estates," and passed in the twenty-second and twenty-third years of the Reign of Charles the II.; and also, in a certain Act, passed in the first year of the Reign of King James the II. contained, shall limit and appoint.
